The first Christ-suffering which every man must experience is the call to abandon the attachments of this world. It is that dying of the old man which is the result of his encounter with Christ. As we embark upon discipleship we surrender ourselves to Christ in union with his death—we give over our lives to death. Thus it begins; the cross is not the terrible end to an otherwise god-fearing and happy life, but it meets us at the beginning of our communion with Christ. *When Christ calls a man, he bids him come and die.*

- 1. Opposition: A cross was used to execute criminals who had the state of Rome in opposition to them.
- 2. Shame: This execution was reserved for the worst criminals, and the victim was usually naked on a cross for hours.
- 3. Suffering: This kind of execution was designed to prolong excruciating pain.
- 4. Death: The aim of crucifixion was death, not torture followed by release.

Be willing to be opposed, to be shamed, to suffer, and to die — all for your allegiance to him. to "take up your cross" meant to treasure Jesus more than we treasure human approval, honor, comfort, and life. Taking up our cross means Jesus has become more precious to us than approval, honor, comfort, and life.
