13 Then God said to Noah, "The end of all living creatures has come before Me, because through them the earth is full of violence. Now behold, I will destroy both them and the earth.


14 Make for yourself an ark of gopher wood; make rooms in the ark and coat it with pitch inside and out.

13 On that very day Noah entered the ark, along with his sons Shem, Ham, and Japheth, and his wife, and the three wives of his sons—

16 And they entered, the male and female of every living thing, as God had commanded Noah.

Then the LORD shut him in.

20 The waters rose and covered the mountaintops to a depth of fifteen cubits. 21 And every creature that had moved upon the earth perished—birds, livestock, animals, every creature that swarms upon the earth, and all mankind.

- 22 Of all that had been on dry land, everything that had the breath of life in its nostrils died. 23 And every living thing on the face of the earth was destroyed—man and livestock, crawling creatures and birds of the air; they were blotted out from the earth, and only Noah remained, and those with him in the ark.
- 24 And the waters prevailed upon the earth for 150 days.

13 In Noah's six hundred and first year, on the first day of the first month, the water had dried up from the earth.

So Noah removed the covering from the ark and saw that the surface of the ground was dry.

14 By the twenty-seventh day of the second month, the earth was fully dry.

15 Then God said to Noah, 16"Come out of the ark, you and your wife and your sons and your sons' wives.

17 Bring out all the living creatures that are with you—birds, livestock, and everything that crawls upon the ground—so that they can spread out over the earth and be fruitful and multiply upon it."

Genesis 8 20 Then Noah built an altar to the LORD. Taking from every kind of clean animal and clean bird, He offered burnt offerings on the altar. 21 When the LORD smelled the pleasing aroma, He said in His heart, "Never again will I curse the ground because of man, even though every inclination of his heart is evil from his youth. And never again will I destroy all living creatures as I have done.

- 4. God owns the destruction of the flood There is no need to make excuses for Him

12 Lessons from the Account of the Flood:

- 5. All sin is against God Himself and is much more evil and destructive than we can imagine
- 6. God does indeed judge sin
- 7. God's judgement falls on ALL people
- 8. God is able to clearly distinguish between the people He is for and the people He is against

2 Peter 2

- 4 For if God did not spare the angels when they sinned, but cast them into hell, delivering them in chains to be held in gloomy darkness until their judgment;
- 5 if He did not spare the ancient world when He brought the flood on its ungodly people, but preserved Noah, a preacher of righteousness, among the eight;

- 2 Peter 2:6 if He condemned the cities of Sodom and Gomorrah to destruction, reducing them to ashes as an example of what is coming on the ungodly;
- 7 and if He rescued Lot, a righteous man distressed by the depraved conduct of the lawless
- 9 if all this is so, then the Lord knows how to rescue the godly from trials and to hold the unrighteous for punishment on the day of judgment.
