Providence is that continued exercise of that divine energy whereby the Creator:

- 1. Preserves all His creatures
- 2. Is operative in all that comes to pass in the world
- 3. Directs all things to their appointed end

Four Things to Remember:

- 1. We will seldom understand God's acts of providence except as we look back
 - and often from a great distance
 - and most often not even in this life

Four Things to Remember:

- 4. The one who truly believes in the providence of God will never:
 - be boastful
 - be ungrateful
 - be fearful

The Question is not:

How can we control, or use, or even understand God's providence?

The Question is:

How can we REST SECURE in God's providential hand?

1 By now Abraham was old and well along in years, and the LORD had blessed him in every way.

Hebrews 6

- 16 Men swear by someone greater than themselves, and their oath serves as a confirmation to end all argument.
- 17 So when God wanted to make the unchanging nature of His purpose very clear to the heirs of the promise, He guaranteed it with an oath.
- 18 Thus by two unchangeable things in which it is impossible for God to lie, we who have fled to take hold of the hope set before us may be strongly encouraged.

Hebrews 6

- 19 We have this hope as an anchor for the soul, firm and steadfast.
- It enters the inner sanctuary behind the curtain,
- 20 where Jesus our forerunner has entered on our behalf.
