

- 2 He looked and saw a well in the field, and there by it lay three flocks of sheep, because the sheep were watered from this well.
- And a large stone covered the mouth of the well. 3 When all the flocks had been gathered there, the shepherds would roll away the stone from the mouth of the well and water the sheep. Then they would return the stone to its place over the mouth of the well.

Then we will water the sheep." 9 While he was still speaking with them, Rachel arrived with her father's sheep, for she was a shepherdess.

18 Since Jacob loved Rachel, he answered, "I will serve you seven years for your younger daughter Rachel." 19 Laban replied, "Better that I give her to you than to another. Stay here with me." 20 So Jacob served seven years for Rachel, yet it seemed but a few days because of his love for her. 21 Finally Jacob said to Laban, "Grant me my wife, for my time is complete, and I want to sleep with her."

22 So Laban invited all the men of that place and prepared a feast. 23 But when evening came, Laban took his daughter Leah and gave her to Jacob, and he slept with her. 24 And Laban gave his servant girl Zilpah to his daughter Leah as her maidservant. 25 When morning came, there was Leah! "What have you done to me?" Jacob said to Laban.

"Wasn't it for Rachel that I served you? Why have you deceived me?" 26 Laban replied, "It is not our custom here to give the younger daughter in marriage before the older. 27 Finish this week's celebration, and we will give you the younger one in return for another seven years of work."
