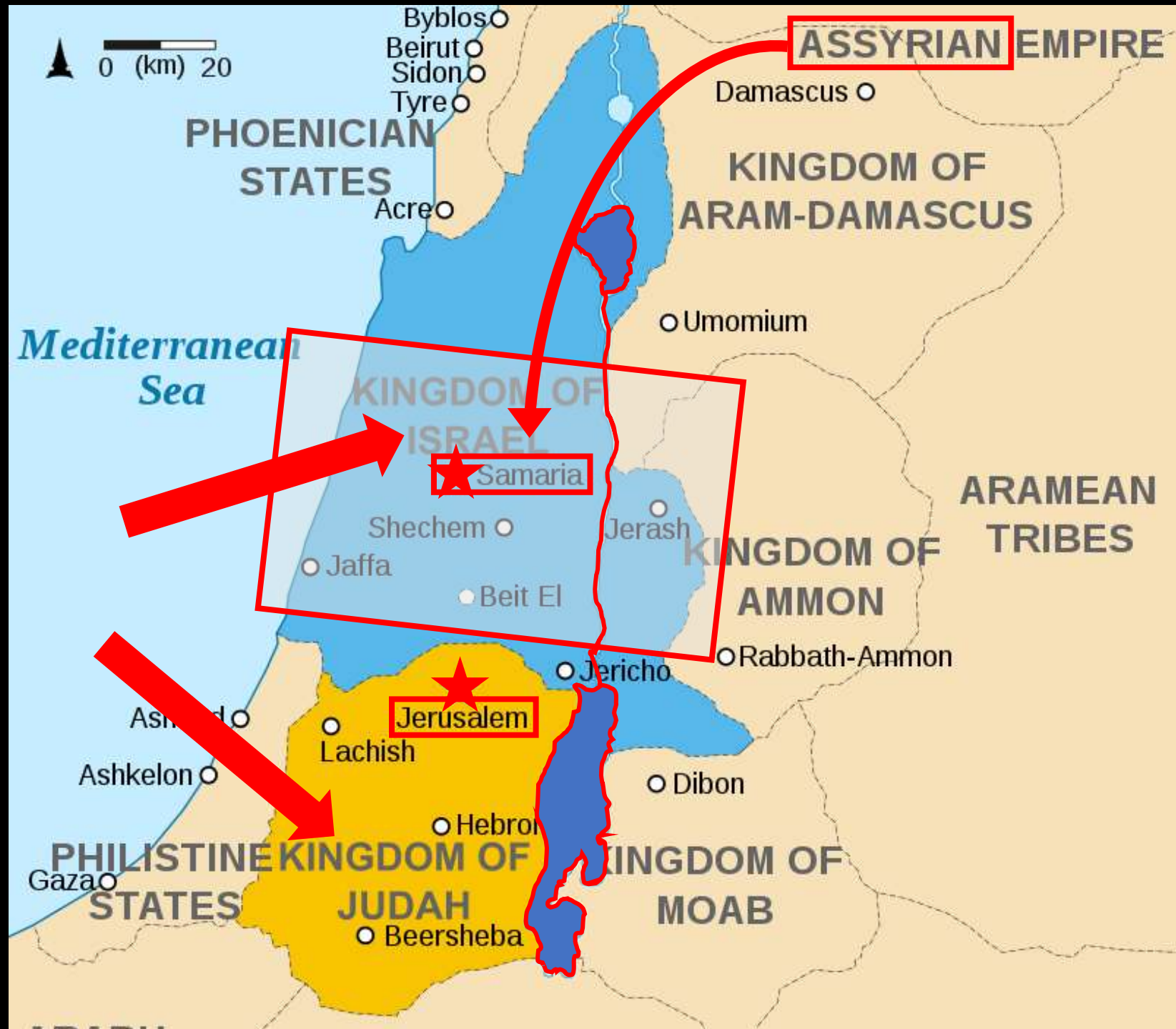

Galatians 3
