# John 11

6 He came to Simon Peter, who asked Him, "Lord, are You going to wash my feet?" 7 Jesus replied, "You do not realize now what I am doing, but later you will understand." 8"Never shall You wash my feet!" Peter told Him. Jesus answered, "Unless I wash you, you have no part with Me."
